SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Kresky was a friend of President Eisenhower's secretary, Ann Whitman. During the course of that friendship she acquired the documents in this collection.

This collection consists of a four-page draft of Dwight D. Eisenhower's 1955 speech in honor of the tenth anniversary of the founding of the United Nations in Eisenhower's hand-writing, a partial transcript of the draft, and a thermofax copy of a portion of the 1943 note to General Eisenhower regarding his appointment to command the Normandy Invasion. As a convenience to researchers, the Library staff have included a copy of the entire 1943 note and the text of the 1955 speech as it was delivered.
