Presiding judge, Superior Court of the State of California for the County of Los Angeles, 1947-1953; Assistant Attorney General in Anti-Trust Division, 1953-1956; Judge, 9th Circuit Court of Appeals, 1956-1970; Assumed senior status 1970-1990.

DESCRIPTION: Personal background; father in banking and ministry; San Diego school strike of 1918; playing football at the University of California; law school and playing football; beginning law practice; origins of the California Republican Assembly; support for Herbert Hoover; 1938 election; Earl Warren's campaign for Attorney General; promoting Richard Nixon and other candidates; Warren's years as governor; helping in Warren's campaigns; appointment of judges; integrating the Los Angeles Bar Association; University of California Alumni Association advocacy; other political figures; appointment as Assistant U.S. Attorney General; anti-trust cases; operation of the Justice Department; when Earl Warren was appointed to the Supreme Court.
