Active in California Republican Party, elected to U.S. House of Representatives, 1953-1974.

DESCRIPTION: Beginning his civil service career; the Youth Authority; candidacy for 1948 Congressional race; California Republicans in the 1940s; convincing Earl Warren to run for Governor in 1942; finance committees; Warren and oil companies; travels with Warren; the Governor's speeches; speech writing; Sacramento executive office; Standley Commission on organized crime; Warren's third campaign for Governor in 1950; the decision to run; Democratic challenger James Roosevelt; Senate race between Helen Gahagan Douglas and Richard Nixon; campaign finance arrangements; anecdote about Warren at ease; 1952 elections; Mailliard's election to Congress; the Republican National Convention; Herbert Brownell and Dwight D. Eisenhower's consideration of Warren for the Supreme Court; Warren as Chief Justice; the relationship between Mailliard and Warren.
